

Chapter 1 Activity Ideas

Materials

Crayons
Colored pencils
Glue
Scissors
String/yarn

Optional Materials:

Hole Punch
Glitter
Stickers
Foam Cut Outs
Fake jewels for the crowns
Fake googly eyes
Party Decorations
Small Stick

Day 1

Piano Craft:

Use the three black keys on the keyboard for the wings of the dragon, and the two black keys for the eyes. Have the students draw in Dreary's face and body. To make the picture come alive, use different decorations to glue on, including the googly eyes, giving Dreary a 3-D effect.

Mirror Craft:

Have the students draw themselves how they think they would look as a dragon. Encourage them to be as creative as possible.

Day 2

Masks:

Note: To save time, have the masks cut out before craft time. Allow the students to pick one or both masks to color and decorate. When they have finished decorating, punch or cut a hole on both sides of the mask. Thread yarn through the holes and tie in back, large enough to fit the child's head. You may also glue a small stick on the edge of one side of the mask, allowing the student to hold the mask up to his/her face.

Day 3

Crown/Tiara:

Note: To save time, have the pieces cut out before class. Depending on the size of the students head, have them decorate the two parts of the crown (three if a larger size is needed), and the two parts of the tiara (add an additional back piece if a larger size is needed). Glue the two or three pieces together to fit around the student's head.

Day 4

Circles:

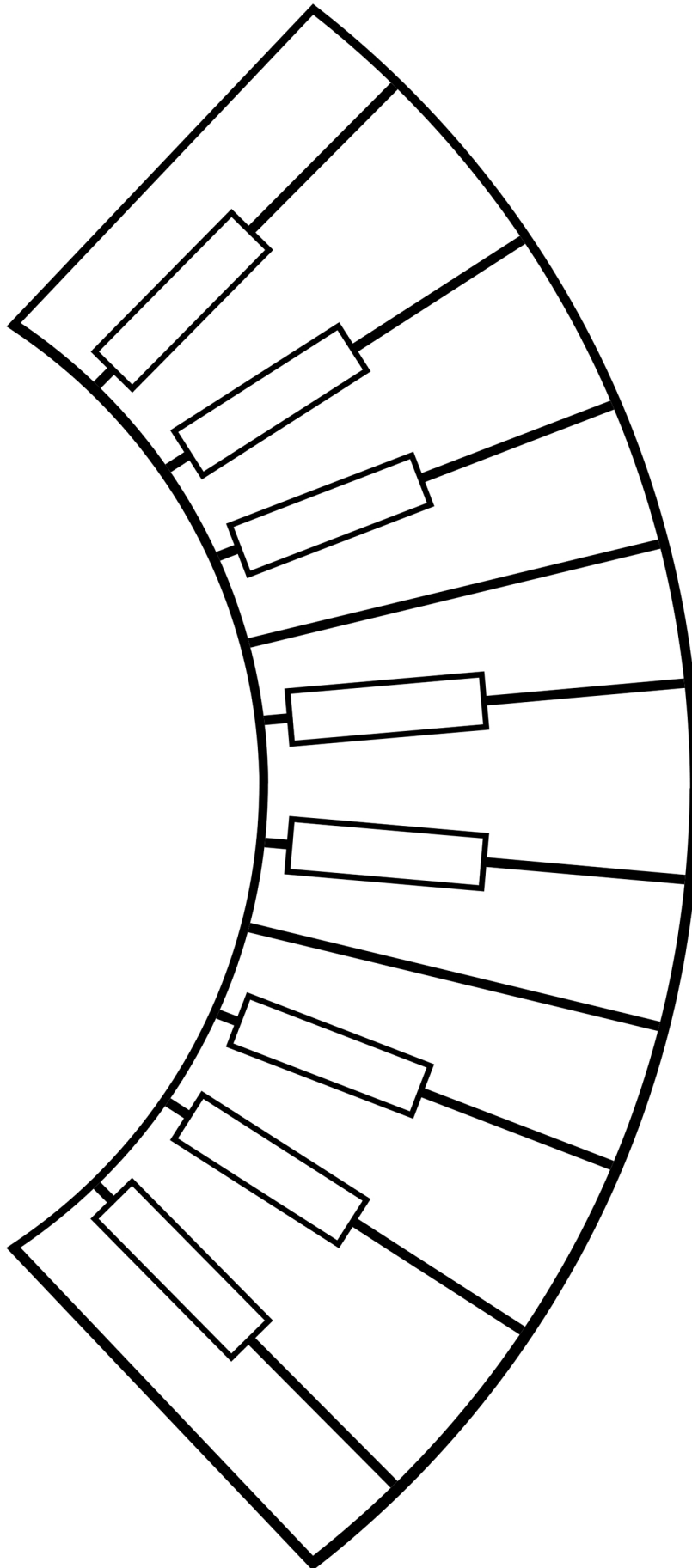
Note: To save time, cut out the circles before class. Allow the students to decorate as many circles as they want. At the end of the camp, the teacher can string all of the circles together to use as a decoration during the final performance for the parents. Feel free to use any other decorations you think the kids might enjoy.

Day 5

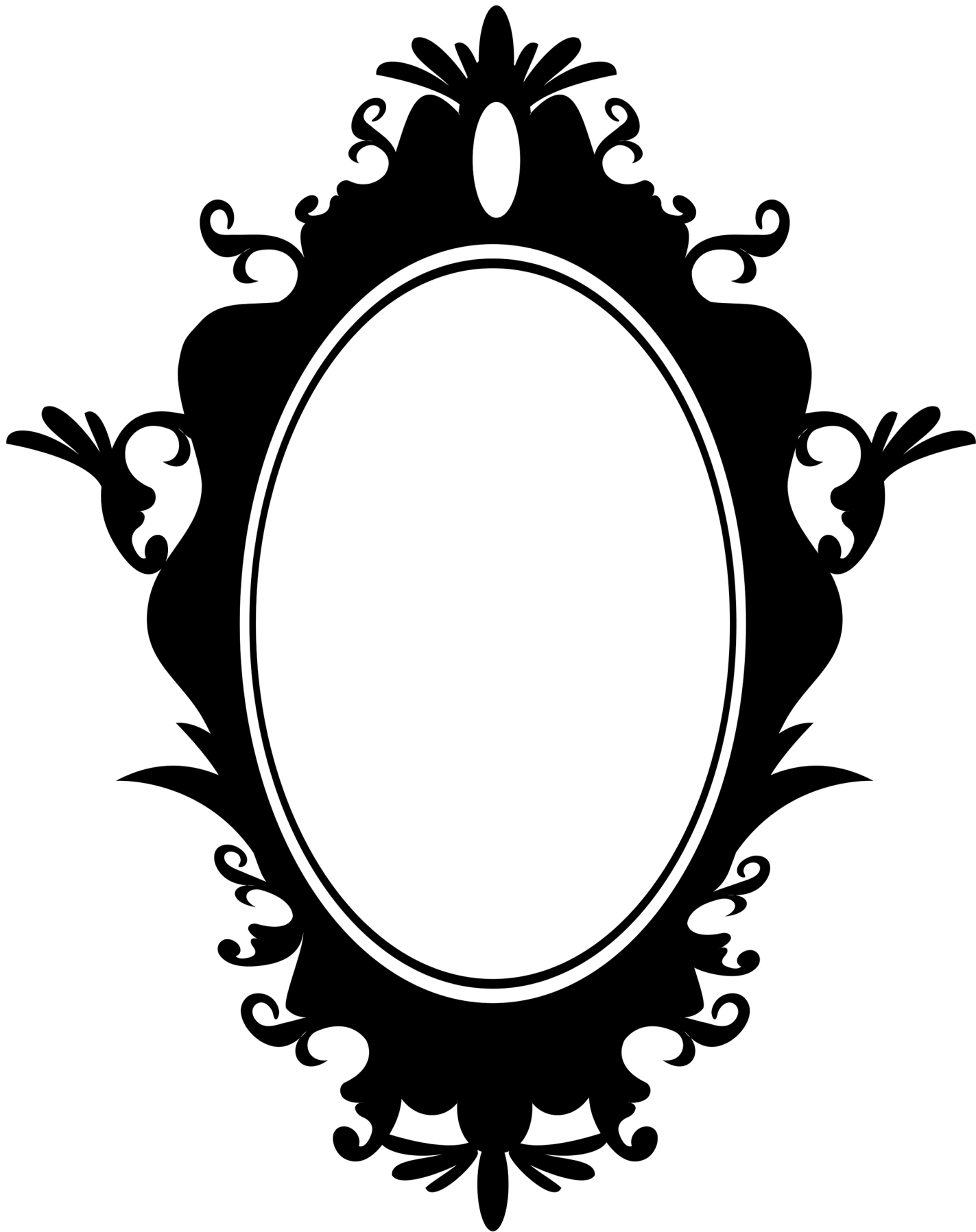
Final Note:

Bring everything together here, and have the students wear their crowns, tiaras and masks during the performance for their parents. Hang up the mirror and the keyboard drawings around the room as an additional decoration. And, remember, let the students be as creative as they wish. There really is no right or wrong way to do any of these fun, and simple crafts.

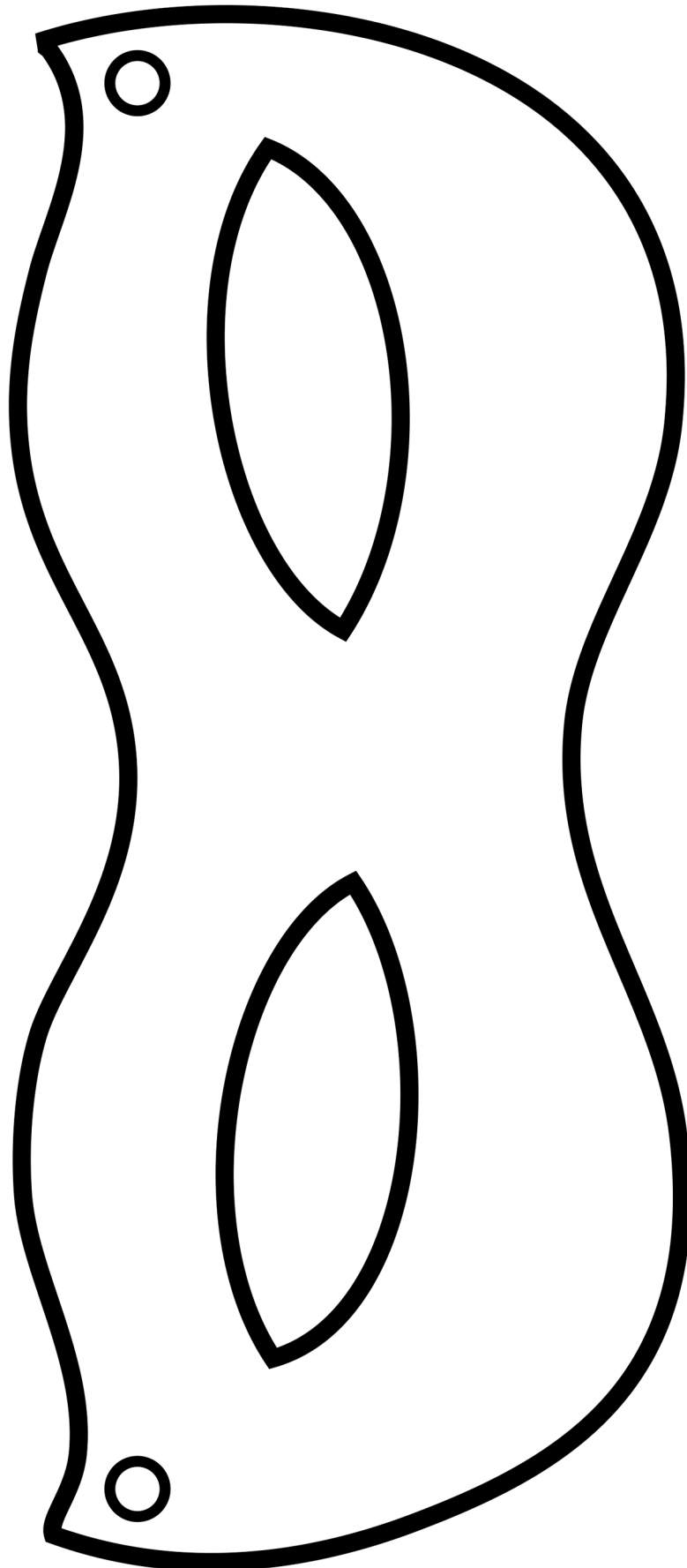

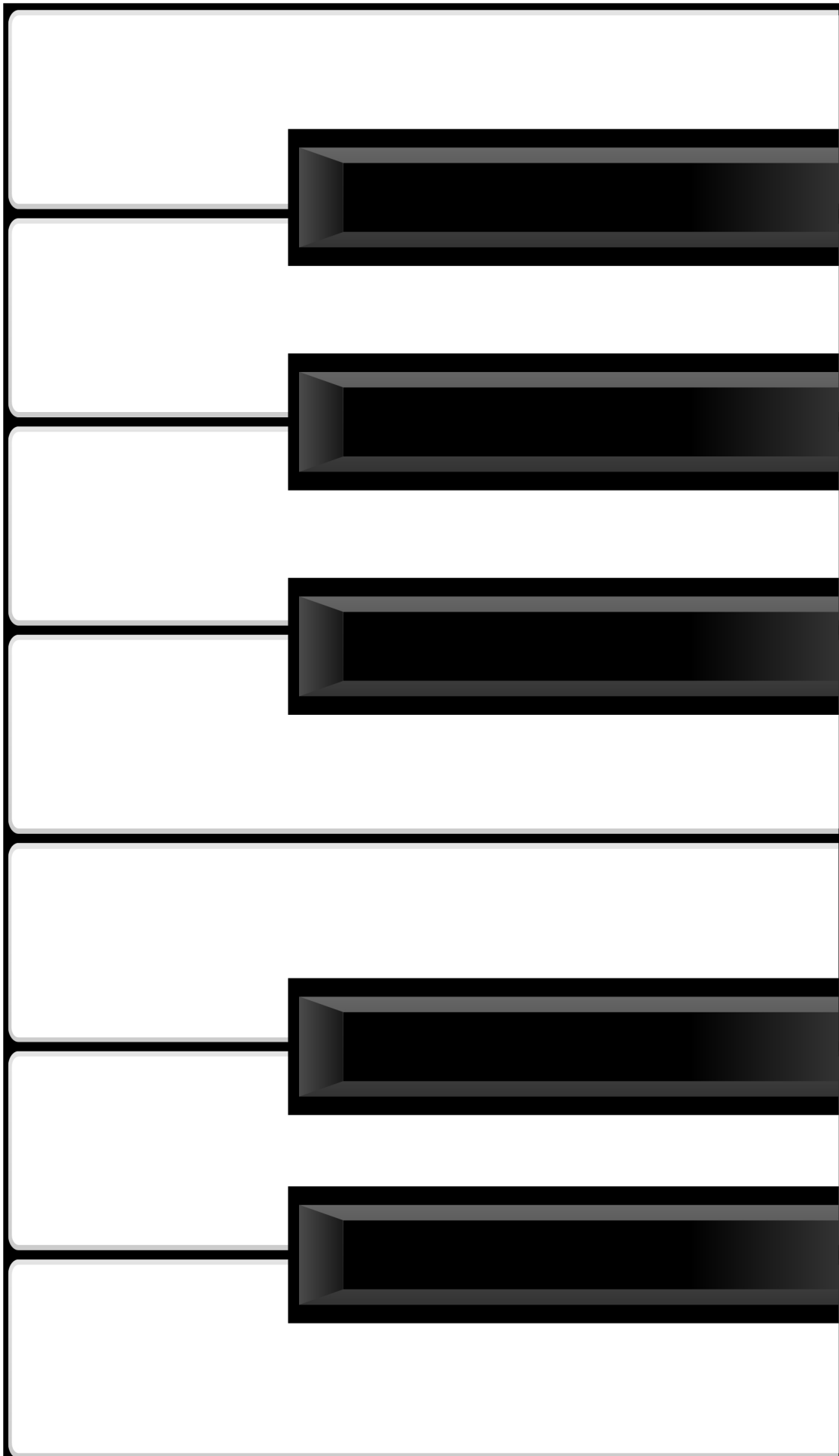

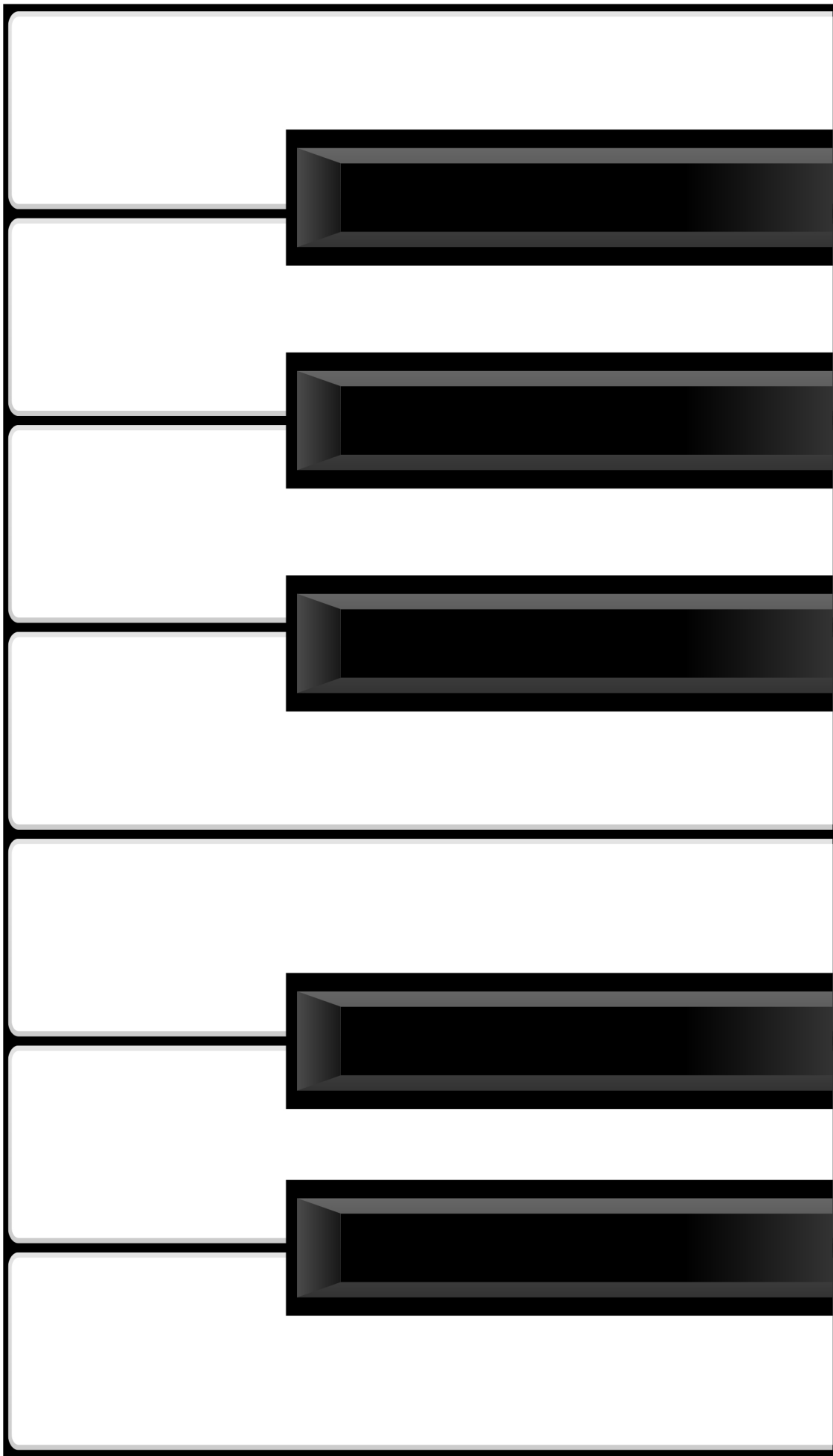
